HLNAC – Bobby Salm reported that the following events are scheduled: Christmas Party on December 5, Wreath orders are being taken, Chili Cook Off on January 22 and Wine Tasting to be announced. They need donations for Halloween candy and items for the silent auction at the Chili cook off, which is HLNAC's only fundraiser. They are also having a raffle for a 22" Visio flat screen TV, tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5, and available at the Office.

Call to Order. The meeting was called to order by Ed Salm, President at 7:00 PM. Other Board Members present were: Neil Schneider, Brian Waldman, Ron Riggen, Mike Lambert, Joe Boarini and Ben Hinshaw. Also present were Charlie Beard, Property Manager, Tracy Montgomery, Secretary and 14 members.

Presentation of Agenda.
Approved as submitted.

Presentation of Minutes

October 11, 2010 Board Meeting.

Approved as submitted.

October 25, 2010 Operations Meeting and Executive Session. Approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report. Joe Boarini reported that revenue for October was \$62,834 and expenses were \$59,165. Year to date revenue is \$1,028,917 and expenses are \$926,802 resulting in year-to-date Net income of \$102,026.

Board Committee Reports.

A&E. Ben Fuchs reported that 1 detached garage, 5 docks and 2 fences were approved in October.

Campground. Ron Riggen said their committee was considering switching some of the permanent and the transient camping sites. Ron also noted that he and Darrell Plunkett have switched positions on the Committee he is now the Vice Chair and Darrell is Chair. There is \$1,555.54 in their checking account.

Clean Up. Mary Williams reported that Clean Sweep will be the fourth Saturday in May. The Committee had developed a "dirty dozen" list of homes earlier in the year and is in the processing of re-checking those for improvement. The Committee will not meet again until April 2011.

Election. Shannon Lieb reported that there are five (5) candidates for the 2011 Board elections: Joe Boarini, Harold Paetow, Ron Riggen, Ed Salm and Andrew Worden. We will be filling four (4) positions.

Government. No report, Mike Foster is the Chair. Harold noted that the flood map for Heritage Lake will be updated.

Planning. Brad Stratmann reported that they will make a presentation to the Board in March and April.

Siltation. Duane Kelly reported that the North end of lake has been dredged and a "stand pipe" will be installed, to lower the basin during periods of no rains. He also noted that he will make a presentation at the next Operations Meeting (11-29) regarding siltation plans for 2011 and beyond.

Manager's Report. Charlie Beard reported that the **Activity Center** will be closed, except for reservations. We will be meeting with the pool contractor regarding final design sometime this month. **Campground** has been winterized. **Marina** is closed for the season and the restroom is winterized. The boat ramp project will be completed while lake is down. **Security** is checking for POA cards, so please be sure to carry them with you when using the common areas and lake. The **Office** hours to 8:00 am to 5:30 pm Monday through Thursday and 8:00 am to 12:00 pm on Fridays, and will remain open during lunch. Visit our **WEBSITE** heritagelakepoa.com for the latest information about events and other "happenings" for the community. **Lincoln Hills** restroom has been winterized.

Delinquent assessments are starting to come in from the collection agencies. In **Maintenance**, Tyler Whiteman has resigned and Jeff Blackburn will take his place.

Old Business Forum. No discussion.

Old Business.

Item "A" 2011 Budget and Fees. It was moved and seconded to pass the 2011 Budget and Fee proposal. After much discussion, Item did not pass, with a vote of 3 – y and 4 – N votes. A budget meeting is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 15, at 7pm.

New Business.

Item "A" Policy 12030 Land Use Restriction. It was moved and seconded that the following proposed policy be adopted: "P12030 – Land Use Restriction This policy is in reference to the HLPOA owned property known as 624 and 623 Jefferson Valley and the Common Property adjacent to these parcels. This area surrounds the Unnamed Tributary of Monachals Fork and the channel drains into Heritage Lake and has been altered through a permit from the following agencies: Indiana Department of Environmental Management, United States Corps of Engineers, Indiana Department of Natural Resource and U. S. Fish and Wildlife Services.

The Heritage Lake Property Owners Association wishes to restrict use of this land and channel, through this Policy.

The Policy was approved, with a vote of 7 – Y and 0 – N. Policy is in effect.

Forum:

Duane Kelly reported that he is taking pictures of all of the coves while the water is down. These photos will provide the Siltation Committee with good information for planning.

Mary Williams asked why the Lake committee had no representation at the Board meetings. There was no response. She also wondered how the Board could pass a land restriction policy and other policies with restrictions were not allowed to be enforced. It was explained that Policy 12030 refers to land the HLPOA owns and the others deal with private property,

Marianne Ash asked the Board members why they didn't approve the budget. There was no response.

Duane Kelly noted that we are not the only area having problems with enforcement, many towns and cities have the same problem.

Ed Salm noted that the Board is working on updating our By Laws which might help in some instances.

Brad Stratmann thanked the office staff for getting information to the Planning Committee. He also asked the four Board members why they voted against the budget.

Adjourned.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 pm.

December, 2010



Although the lake is down, the leaves are down and the temperature is dropping, the neighborhood's spirits are high as we prepare for the Christmas Season. Besides the holiday lights going up, lots of things are happening around the lake that I'd like to share with you.

POOL

Charlie and I met with the owner of the pool company on November 23rd. We made some final, minor changes to the architect's drawings. We expect the State to approve the plans and the County to issue permits by mid-December. At that point, we'll sign the contract. Charlie will move the road soon to make room for the pool, splash area, wading pool and bath house. Our target is to be open by Memorial Day.

CELL TOWER

If you drive by the 32 acres, you'll see the AT&T antennas are installed and the electronics building is on-site. The tower should be active with AT&T service during the first quarter, 2011. As soon as it's operating and leaves are on the trees, we'll test cell phone receptivity at the Campground. Hopefully, the reception will be satisfactory and will resolve the safety issue of timely access to emergency phone calls. If not, we'll have to develop a plan other than reliance on standard cell phone service.

BOAT RAMP

We discovered damage to both sides of the boat ramp when the lake was lowered this Fall. The center of the ramp is in satisfactory condition. Warning posts have been placed near the damaged concrete to prevent damage to boats and trailers. We'll have an engineer inspect the ramp while the lake is down and develop specifications for a complete replacement of the ramp. Our plan is to do that replacement the next time the lake is lowered which will likely be in three years.

STRATEGIC PLAN

Earlier this year, I discussed our intention to develop a strategic plan to map a direction for the development of the Heritage Lake Community. The first step in the process is to identify the demographic trends that we've experienced in recent years. We expect the 2010 census data to be available in March, 2011 so the project will be on hold until then.

BY-LAWS

The Board has invested much time in a review of our by-laws and we hope to have a number of positive changes to present to the community shortly. More to come on this project soon.

food for thought

IS UNITY POSSIBLE? We live in a world that is separated by all kinds of things. We are divided by our politics, our borders and even by our technology. It's rather ironic; today's technology allows us to communicate with a person halfway around the world with as much ease as our next door neighbor. But for all the virtual communication, every study shows that people are becoming less skilled in interpersonal communication and are growing more lonely and isolated by the year.

This lack of unity has some ugly side effects. Medical studies find it causes hostility, anxiety, despair, and even a loss of reality. As we slide into an ever more fractured culture it is a fair question to ask; is unity even possible?

Believe it or not, this is a sideways entrance into the Christmas message. Division in humanity is really nothing new. In 4 BC, the world was every bit as splintered as it is today, even among those who claimed to know the One True God. The people of Israel were hopelessly divided politically and spiritually. But despite the division, they all clung to one common thread of hope.

That thread came in the words of a prophet written some 700 years earlier. He said, **"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."** Isaiah 9:6

This was the hope of the "Messiah," and the hope of the Messiah in a word was "unity." They realized that we need a power beyond our human nature to unite us.

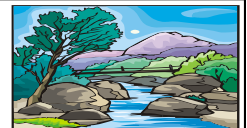

The Clear Creek Conservancy District board of directors met October 21, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. at the district's office. Below is the unapproved meeting minutes.



Directors Present: Brian Waldman, Robert C. Hansen & J. Duane Kelly

Also attending: Kathy Deer, Administrative and Financial Manager; Doug Clodfelter, Plant Operator and Operations Manager; Roger Wright, Assistant Chief, Floyd Township Fire Protection District and Jim Hazelwood.

Bob Hansen moved to approve the minutes of the October meeting, as corrected for the road bond amount to \$15,000. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Kathy Deer reviewed the financial report for the month ending October 31, 2010. Duane Kelly moved to approve the financial report and Register of Claims, dated October 22 through November 18, 2010. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Kathy Deer provided a written report. There will be no CDs maturing before the end of the year. The \$15,000 road bond was filed with the Auditor's office and a copy provided to the Putnam County Highway Dept. The joint inspection of the drainage tubes at the principal spillway was held on October 27. No major structural concerns were found. The election notice was published in the Banner Graphic. Investigation is ongoing with the Auditor and Treasurer to address issues of how to better handle the recordkeeping for the exceptional benefits assessments. A database for the district's records is being created. The billing summary shows 1,327 active accounts with the recent hookups of GB036 and MS266. The October/November billing statements were mailed November 4 and payment is due by December 15. A billing software update is available from Masterlinx Enterprise Management System, the company that bought out Greentree. More information will be obtained about costs and benefits.

Doug Clodfelter provided a written report showing the average daily flow at 161,000 GPD and peak flow at 202,000 GPD for the month of October with .8" rainfall recorded. The new 25 kW CAT generator and auto-transfer switch was ordered from MacAllister Power for LS P2. Delivery is expected in about 17 weeks. MacAllister performed the semi-annual maintenance on the existing generator on November 3. Mike Neese installed a new junction box with terminals at LS P3. Liquid Waste Management hauled 496,000 gallons of sludge to the district's 8 acre field and 10 acres on Greeson. This is approximately 200,000 gallons more than normal fall application since one of the oxidation ditches was taken out of service because of low flows due to lack of rain. Taking this ditch out of service for now will also save on the electric bill. Shannon McCullough will have a bill to the district for his services when he was making the new connection at MS266. There was no lateral for MS 266 and the lateral serving MS297 was broken. Because of the size of this sewer line, saddles were shipped overnight to install and repair these laterals.

Doug reported that Bainbridge has two 5 hp Myers 3 phase 230 volt pumps that were rebuilt a year ago. Since Bainbridge no longer needs those pumps, he recommended the district purchase them for use in a couple of the district's lift stations at \$100.00 each. Robert Hansen moved to purchase the two pumps from Bainbridge at \$100.00 each. Duane Kelly seconded. Vote unanimous.

Roger Wright requested the board consider allowing a concrete pad and small cover to house a gas-engine water pump to be used by the fire department be installed near where the POA and siltation barge are moored. He explained that not all local fire department's tankers responding to a fire have pumping capabilities and this pump would be used to fill the tankers with lake water. Robert Hansen moved to allow the structure as long as it does not create access issues. Roger Wright will proceed with funding and obtain more structural information. He is to work with Doug Clodfelter regarding placement of the structure. Duane Kelly seconded. Vote unanimous.

Duane Kelly suggested that some type of barrier be installed to prevent the loss of fish when the lake is next lowered. It was agreed that further investigation is needed to determine the type of fish being lost and best location for the barrier should one be beneficial.

The next regular meeting is set for 10 a.m. on Thursday, December 16, 2010, at the district's office.


