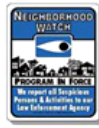

Announcements:

Clear Creek Conservancy – No Report
Floyd Township Fire Department – Roger Wright reported they have had 192 runs, to date. Also they have been repairing the dry hydrants and all are working (or will be when the water level gets up). FTFD are in the process of writing specifications for a new “rescue unit”. The estimate cost of the unit is around \$235,000 and the good news is that FTFD has secured funding, with no additional cost to their constituents.

Neighborhood Watch – No December meeting, they’ll meet Jan. 12th at 7PM

HLNAC –Ed Salm reported that the Christmas Party on the 5th was a great success,

Call to Order. The meeting was called to order by Ed Salm, President at 7:00 PM. Other Board Members present were: Neil Schneider, Brian Waldman, Ron Rigger, Mike Lambert, Joe Boarini, Jim McCrary and Ben Hinshaw. Also present were Charlie Beard, Property Manager, Tracy Montgomery, Secretary and only 5 POA members.

Presentation of Agenda. Approved as submitted.

Presentation of Minutes

November 8, 2010 Board Meeting. Approved as submitted.

November 29, 2010 Operations Meeting. Approved as submitted.

November 29, 2010 Executive Session. Approved as submitted.

Treasurer’s Report. Joe Boarini reported that revenue for November was \$59,547 and expenses were \$3,360. Year to date revenue is \$1,088,460 and

expenses are \$930,260, resulting in year-to-date Net income of \$158,200.

Board Committee Reports.

A&E. Ben Fuchs reported that 1 detached garage, 2 docks, 1 addition, 1 deck and 1 fence were approved in November. Ben asked the Board to approve Joe Moneta to serve on the committee; the Board approved. Tom Novak has resigned and Joe Moneta will serve as Secretary to the Committee.

Election. No Report.

Government. Mike Foster reported that the County has received a grant to resurface and improve CR 725 E – CR 525 from Groveland to the Campground road with a project completion date of 2014.

Planning. No Report.

Siltation. Duane Kelly reported that the North end of lake has been dredged and a “stand pipe” was installed. Their next meeting will be in March 2011.

Manager’s Report. Charlie reported that the **Activity Center** will be closed, except for reservations. The following programs are available through the Center: line dancing, cancer support group and after school activities. Final design of the pool has been submitted to the State for approval. The pool/bath house has been approved by the County. Hopefully, after the first of the year, we will see some dirt being moved in preparation for the pool. **Boat Ramp** should be surveyed while water is down and specifications will be developed early next year. **Security** is checking for POA cards, so please be sure to carry them with you when using the common areas and lake. The **Office** will be closed from December 24th through January 2nd, open again on January 3rd. Visit our **website** heritagelakepoa.com for the latest information about events and other “happenings” for the community.

The office is in process of getting our data bases into Quick Books.

Old Business Forum. No discussion.

New Business.

Item “A” 2011 Budget and Fees. It was moved and seconded to pass the 2011 Budget and Fee proposal. The Budget was approved with a vote of 7 – Yes and 1 – No (Brian Waldman).

It was moved and seconded to “Set aside Policy P1001, Section D.2, which requires two votes for approval of the Budget, in order to move the Budget from New Business to Old Business. This motion was approved with a vote of 8 – Y and 0 – N.

The 2011 Budget received final approval.

Item “B” Boat Ramp Engineering. It was moved and seconded that we hire First Group Engineering to survey the boat ramp area at a cost of \$1,500. This is in anticipation that we will contract with an engineering firm to develop specifications for a new ramp, after we have the survey completed. The Board approved the motion with a vote of 8 – Y and 0 – N.

Item “C” Quick Books Upgrade. It was moved and seconded that we spend \$2,600 to upgrade to Quick Books Enterprise Solutions. This will allow us to consolidate our entire system to one program format. The Board approved the motion with 8 – Y and 0 – N votes.

Forum. Lois Napier asked if the Marina beach was on the schedule to be “leveled” while the water is down. She was assured that it would be completed.

Roger Wright asked if we would talk to the County Highway Department about the guard rail over the spillway.

Adjourned. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 pm.

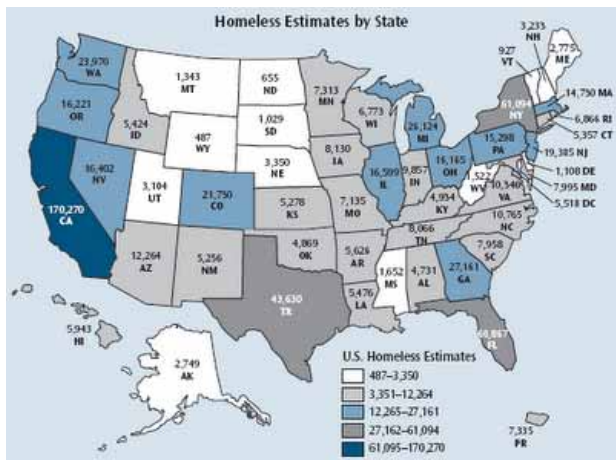

food for thought

I suppose it shouldn't surprise me, but it always does; what happens when your life is touched by the life-story of another. Somehow, our own human experience becomes the richer for it.

Our community is filled with incredible stories; stories of survival, courage, and pressing on against overwhelming hardship. Challenges like cancer. One of these stories belongs to an exceptional lady by the name of Cindy Ware.

I'll let her share her story:

I was born in Indianapolis, graduated from IUPUI, was married and lived a very happy and active life until January of 2003. It was then I was diagnosed with Stage II breast cancer. The challenge of chemotherapy, surgery and radiation was intensified by the financial strain on my family. I was blessed with a full recovery only to lose my only brother a year later and then my mother a short time after that.

My husband and I moved to Heritage Lake in 2007 and like so many other couples, planned to enjoy our ensuing years together on the lake. But within that first year I lost my husband Gary. My Gettysburg neighbors and church friends helped me through this difficult period and I decided to remain here at the lake.

The trial of my breast cancer was all but forgotten when in January of 2010 I was diagnosed with a suspicious fracture of the collar bone. The cancer had returned. Through the most of 2010 I have been in treatment and have been blessed once again with the ability to continue working and meet the demands of daily life.

What makes Cindy exceptional isn't that she has simply survived her challenges; it is what she has done with them. In each case she has taken her trials and turned them into a tool to help others.

I know that Cindy's isn't the only cancer story. Just across the street from me is a woman named Sarah. The attitude and courage with which she is facing her cancer, both humbles and inspires me. It seems we all know someone; a family member, a friend, a neighbor down the street who has been touched by cancer.

Heritage Lake is a unique community, we live separately and together at the same time. People could drive to other communities and participate in a support group, but what if we could have one in our own community? What if those facing cancer, those who survived it, and their friends and family could get together right here? For me, three words come to mind: *enriching, inspiring, and empowering.*

Cindy must feel that way too. She has coordinated an organizational meeting for just such a group. She has involved medical professionals and others who have helped *her* along the way. The meeting will be held at the Activity Center on Monday, January 17th at 6:30pm. If you could use the support or you'd like to be a support, you are welcome to this meeting.

Something happens when people share life stories. Somehow we become richer and stronger for it. Here is an opportunity to do just that. Anyway, it is certainly food for thought.

December 16, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. at the district's office.
Below is the unapproved meeting minutes.**



Directors Present: Brian Waldman, Robert C. Hansen & J. Duane Kelly

Also attending: Kathy Deer, Administrative and Financial Manager; Doug Clodfelter, Plant Operator and Operations Manager; Charlie Beard, Heritage Lake POA.

Bob Hansen moved to approve the minutes of the November meeting. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Kathy Deer reviewed the financial report for the month ending November 30, 2010. Robert Hansen moved to approve the financial report and Register of Claims, dated November 19 through DECEMBER 16, 2010. Duane Kelly seconded. Vote unanimous.

Duane Kelly moved to encumber 2010 funds to next year for the purchase and installation costs of generators for certain lift stations. Funds to be encumbered are from 362-Repairs & Equipment and 451 – Lift Station Improvements. Robert Hansen seconded. Vote unanimous. One generator has already been ordered but the delivery date is not expected until next year.

Kathy Deer provided a written report. Duane Kelly has been nominated to serve a 4-year term representing Patriots Landing and Gettysburg subdivisions. The final electronic version of the State Board of Accounts audit was received. After discussion with the Putnam County Treasurer and Auditor, there will probably be no changes in the way the EBAs are billed and collected. The fall EBA check was deposited on December 14 as follows: JV EBA - \$57,509.38, MS EBA - \$27,585.61, 94 EBA - \$50,963.30 and 01 EBA - \$62,899.60. The funds were deposited to the General Fund. The Treasurer provided printouts which will be used to update the district's EBA records. The billing summary shows 1,327 active accounts, the same as last month. The October/November billing statements were due December 15. Late fees totaling \$1,627.73 were added to 330 accounts. There were 66 lien warning letters mailed on December 8. Liens will be filed on December 20 if payment is not received. The software upgrade proposal from Master Meter Systems would cost \$5,000 with the same \$1,200 annual support fee as the current Greentree software. While there are many advantages to this new web-based program, it was not recommended to upgrade at this time.

Doug Clodfelter provided a written report showing the average daily flow at 165,000 GPD and peak flow at 375,000 GPD for the month of November with 3.2" rainfall recorded. The spillway gate was closed on December 15 so the lake can begin to refill. Shannon McCullough completed the spillway tubes riprap job on November 26. New capacitors, starters and relays were installed in LS G4. The treatment plant's return lift station pump 2 was completely worn out and a new pump with a ceramic coated impeller was ordered from Straeffler Pump & Supply at an estimated cost of \$5,047.00.

The generators for the lift stations take approximately 5 months to be delivered. Doug recommended that two more generators be ordered, one to be paid out of the encumbered funds from 2010 and one to be paid out of next year's budget. Robert Hansen moved to approve the purchase of two more generators. Once delivered and installed this spring, the district will have generators in LS G5, M6 and M7. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Doug Clodfelter expressed appreciation to Charlie Beard for the work on the POA's maintenance building and the board commended the Heritage Lake POA for the new fencing and making the maintenance shed area look nice.

The next regular meeting is set for 10 a.m. on Thursday, January 20, 2011, at the district's office.
