Clear Creek Conservancy – No Report

Floyd Township Fire Department – Roger Wright reported that there were 137 runs to date. He also noted that there is a vacancy on the Fire Board, if anyone is interested in serving they should contact Commissioner Beck.

Neighborhood Watch – Harold Paetow reported that there were some vehicle break-ins and a boat and trailer stolen.

HLCS – No Report.

HLNAC – Jan Sallee reported that the Saturday Farmer's Market will continue through August.

POA Security – Denna DeLaCruz gave a detailed report for land and lake security citing the number and type of each incident. (Details can be obtained

Call to Order. The meeting was called to order by Neil Schneider, President at 7:00 PM. Other Board Members present were: Mike Lambert, Brian Waldman, Harold Paetow, Ron Rikken, Brian Waldman, Ed Salm and Joe Boarini. Also present were Charlie Beard, Property Manager, Tracy Montgomery, Recording Secretary and 30 members.

Presentation of Agenda.

Approved as submitted.

Presentation of Minutes

July 11, 2011 Board Meeting. Approved as submitted.

July 25, 2011 Operations Meeting. Ed Salm noted that the paragraph regarding Community Sirens should read "The Board asked Charlie to find out who is responsible for the sirens."

Approved as altered.

July 25, 2011 Executive Session. Approved as submitted.

August 3, 2011 Executive Session. Approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report. Joe Boarini reported that the revenue for July was \$148,211 and expenses were \$151,551, resulting in negative income of \$3,340. Year to date revenue is \$864,765 and expenses are \$695,861, resulting in net income of \$168,904.

Board Committee Reports.

A&E. Ben Fuchs reported that 1 porch/deck, 1 dock, 1 boat lift, 1 garage/porch, 1 room addition, 1 gazebo and 1 boat slip were approved for July.

Campground. Ron Rikken noted that all but 7 full time sites are full. The storage unit for shelter house is completed. The balance in their account is \$1,866.71.

Clean Up. Mary Williams reported that they have been gathering information regarding empty houses and un-mowed lots. Brush pile was burned to nothing, but has been built back up. The committee is working on trying to deal with the brush area

and its appearance. The fall garage Sale will be September 15, 16 & 17.

Election. Shannon requested the HLPOA purchase some software to scan the ballots. He was asked to contact the office and turn in his specifications.

Government. Mike Foster reported that the County highway is getting information and costs to repair the culvert in Victory Hills.

Lake Committee. Kent Hoops reported that the Feast 'N Ski was a success, and he wanted to thank everyone who supported the event. Many of the buoys have been damaged by boats, in fact 3, or 4, have been removed until they can get repaired. The committee is looking to stock Walleye in the fall.

Planning. Dave Charrlin reported that the committee will have a presentation to the Board in November or December.

Siltation. Duane Kelly reported that the East Basin and East Creek work will begin within a couple of weeks. They will also try to plant trees in September.

Manager's Report.

Charlie reported that the **Activity Center** will be open seven days a week from 12 pm to 8 pm. There is a cancer support group meeting on the first and third Monday of every month, a Bible study group meeting on Tuesdays and Zumba will be coming soon on Thursday evenings.

The **pool** is under construction and will be open soon.

The **Campground** has seven open spaces and preliminary work has begun on updating the electrical system.

Marina business has picked up tremendously since the rains have subsided. There is a new sign at the Marina, stop by and check it out – this one was donated to us. Some buoys have been removed for repair.

Security has had to replace a boat motor.

A **\$500 Reward** has been established for the arrest and conviction of vandalizing POA property. Late assessments have been sent to the collection agencies. 2012 Budget preparation is underway. We have replaced the well pump that serves the Clubhouse, Activity Center and Pool. Charlie gave an apology for his article in the Highlights, it was misleading and not very clear – he is sorry for any confusion this has caused.

Old Business Forum.

There were no comments.

Old Business. No items listed.

New Business.

A & E Rule Proposal. Ed Salm moved and it was seconded to approve the revised A & E Rules as presented. Ed then asked that the motion include a few amendments. After some discussion, the Board agreed to table this motion until the next meeting.

Special Rules Request. Joe Boarini noted that on August 22 and 23, 2011 they will be having “bare foot skiing” classes. Due to the fact smooth water is highly recommended for this activity, he is requesting the Board to waive the “lake directional rule” for August 22 and 23, 2011, only. This will allow the class to utilize the lake to its fullest capacity and will not impede any other activity. The Board agreed to waive the ruling for August 22 and 23, 2011.

Open Forum.

Lois Napier announced that breakfast will be served at the Marina on August 13 and the Snack Shack will be in operation over Labor Day Weekend – serving the almost world famous rib eye steak sandwiches.

Kent Hoops noted that the Lake Committee will be bringing rules recommendations to the next Board meeting.

Jan Sallee announced that Kid’s Count Day Camp will be having a garage sale at the Activity Center and they are looking for donations. The sale is in conjunction with the Community Garage Sale on September 15, 16 and 17.

Bill Livvix noted that Putnam County gets approximately \$3.2 million dollars for roads (budget for Putnam County Highway Department). He also noted that he thinks our roads are in good shape.

Deanna DeLaCruz announced that **Barry Barger** has been helping her with Security.

Diane Talbert wanted clarification on which roads the survey was asking about. It was noted that only the roads within Heritage Lake community were considered.

Missy Edgar asked if the federal government has responded to a funding request for the bridge/culvert in Victory Hills. It was noted that they had not.

John Gilmour noted that Patriot’s Landing pond had a lot of algae and weed growth. He also wanted to know if we ever looked into solar power aerators for the ponds. Charlie will check into this.

Curtis Talbert noted that by increasing the size of the homes required, we will reduce the number of homes being built and leave a lot of vacant lots.

Roger Wright asked if we had a list of property going up for sale at the next tax sale. It was noted that we had a copy of the last Hoosier Topics

newspaper in the office, which has a listing.

John Gilmour asked the Board to consider allowing people to build the size of house that was “legal” when they bought their property.

Pat Livvix said she heard a rumor that the pool was \$70,000 over budget. She was assured that was not the case and when the final figures are put together they will be published in the Highlights.

Lori Dotlitch thanked the Board for their hard work.

Adjournment.

Mike Lambert moved the meeting to be adjourned; this was seconded and approved at 8:30PM.

If we can see the outward signs of what lack of sleep can do, just imagine what effect it has on the inside!

To give you a guideline to follow Mayo Clinic recommends:

Infants: to get 14-15 hours; Toddlers: 12-14 hours;

School Age Children: 10-11 hours and Adults: 7-9 hours.

Things that affect the amount of sleep needed:

Pregnancy ~ increase need for sleep

Aging ~ older adults need the same as younger

Previous sleep deprivation ~ increases the need for sleep

Sleep Quality ~ if you wake up frequently during the night you may need to nap during the day; Stress ~ increase the need for sleep

How are you doing?

When we go to sleep is also a factor. Dave Frahm ND, CNC, CNHP, MH and many others concur that the hours before midnight are twice as important for sleep as those afterwards. Growth Hormone (a potent healing agent) is released during pre-midnight hours. So it would behoove us to make sure we are getting ample sleep prior to midnight.

If you have problems falling asleep try a warm lavender bath before bed. Do not exercise prior to bedtime or engage in activities that produce anxiety, i.e. discussing finances or serious problems, watching movies or playing video games that produce anxiousness.

Also avoid:

Alcohol and nicotine; Do not eat 3 hrs before bedtime; Watch caffeine intake (coffee, tea, chocolate, soda) the effects can last up to 12 hrs.

Don't forget to drink water! You should be drinking 1/2 your body weight in ounces. Exercise at least 3-5 times each week, and eat or drink your veggies!

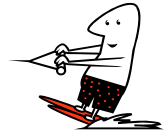



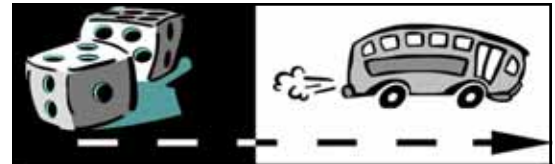

The Clear Creek Conservancy District board of directors met

AUGUST 18, 2011, at 10 a.m. at the district's office.

Directors Present: Robert C. Hansen, Brian Waldman & J. Duane Kelly



Also attending: Kathy Deer, Administrative and Financial Manager; Doug Clodfelter, Plant Operator and Operations Manager, ; Charlie Beard, Heritage Lake POA, and Jim Hazelwood.

Bob Hansen moved to approve the minutes of the July meeting. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Kathy Deer reviewed the financial report for the month ending July 31, 2011. Duane Kelly moved to approve the financial report and Register of Claims, dated July 22 through AUGUST 18, 2011. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Robert Hansen moved to adopt Resolution 2011-4 to increase monthly sewer access fees from \$25.00 to \$26.00 effective December 1, 2011, discontinuing charges for services no longer provided and to add some policy wording to the rate resolution. Duane Kelly seconded. Vote unanimous.

Kathy Deer provided a written report. Two CD's at First National Bank will mature August 23 and will be reinvested. The rental for the sewer camera was paid. The legal notice for the 2012 budget hearing date of the September 15 and adoption on October 20 at the district's regular 10 a.m. board meetings has been submitted. The County Council will conduct their non-binding review of the budget at 4:25 p.m. on August 23. The notice for the sale of the tank truck has been sent to the Banner and should be published on August 22 and August 29. A response to a letter from an attorney regarding sewer access fees on a lot sold at tax sale that no longer has a home on it was reviewed. The tax deed has not yet been issued. It is likely the sewer lateral will be capped and disconnected from the sewer collection system. The billing summary shows 1,330 active accounts, one more than last month. The June/July billing was due August 15. Late fees of \$1,847.92 were added to 374 accounts. There were 60 lien warning letters mailed. There are currently 57 lien documents prepared for filing once the 10-day notice period is over on August 19.

Kathy Deer confirmed that the Fillmore Volunteer Fire Department has had a tanker truck from Clear Creek since about 1996 which was to be returned to Clear Creek if and when they are done with it. Robert Hansen moved to grant all rights and title to the truck to the Fillmore Volunteer Fire Department. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

Doug Clodfelter provided a written report showing the average daily flow at 196,000 GPD and peak flow at 308,000 GPD for the month of July with .87 inches precipitation. Graves Plumbing has installed the new control panel for LS V2 which was the lift station damaged by a vehicle earlier this year. Once the concrete pad is poured and the final bills received, the insurance company will be provided all the costs for repairs. The Omni-site batteries have been checked by Mike Neese and two batteries were replaced. The gear drive for the south clarifier was sent to Quality Repair to be rebuilt at a cost of \$1,800. A new one would cost \$4,200. The twelve caster wheels on the south clarifier skimmer assembly were replaced. Don Allen has finished painting the lift stations in Mill Springs and Lincoln Hills. A flange assembly for LS M1 was ordered from Quality Repair at a cost of \$1,120 and has been installed.

Jim Hazelwood brought up discussion of an additional parking area on the district's property. The lane to the creek is posted to prevent access by vehicles due to property damage by off-roaders in the creek crossing and field. This area can be accessed by walking only. Robert Hansen moved to authorize the parking lot installation at the location near the far end of the trail that had been considered last year for a 50' x 60' lot at a cost not to exceed \$2,500.00. A parking lot in this area would be beneficial to shore fishermen and more visible for enforcement of rules that only Heritage Lake POA members are allowed access. Brian Waldman seconded. Vote unanimous.

The board set the next regular meeting for 10 a.m. on Thursday, September 15, 2011, at the district's office.
